
Congratulations MES Students!

Mr. Coberly's Counseling Corner

It's April and the transition to the next grade is just around the corner! It's natural for children to feel nervousness and "stress" ... but we don't want it to get out of hand. Children need to know it is ok to have these feelings and to learn to express their concerns to help manage those feelings. It is also essential to provide accurate answers to questions. "Knowledge is Power" when it comes to handling the "what ifs" and/or "unknowns" of a transition or any anxiety. Allowing a child to share their concerns and ask questions is also a great lesson on how to "self advocate": express a need and create support! This is such an important part of growing up and becoming independent. So, whatever grade your child is in, it's a great time to check in and be in tune with how they are feeling and what

Grab your helmet

- · Make sure it fits properly
- Wear it correctly

inflated

Be aware

 Watch for road hazards like potholes, puddles, rocks, or animals

 Always keep two hands on the handlebars of your

bike

Obey all traffic laws



Helmets reduce the risk of head injury by at least 45%, brain injury by 33%, facial injury by 27%, and fatal injury by 29%. (Journal of Psychology; Journal of Safety Research)

Every year, 26,000 children are seen in emergency departments for traumatic brain injury related to bicycle-riding. (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention)

Apart from the automobile, bicycles are tied to more childhood

injuries than any other consumer product. (Saving Children: A

guide to injury prevention)
