What is NOOK?

NOOK (Need Of Our Kids) is a non-profit resource center started by parents in the Franklin Special School District to provide basic essentials (shoes, socks, underwear, basic hygiene and feminine hygiene) to students in the district on demand at the request of a school's nurse, counselor or social worker.

How you can help?

Please consider a donation of toothpaste, shampoo, soap or deodorant to your school's NOOK collection house. The collection houses are located in the school lobby. Items can be placed inside the houses at any time during the school year. NOOK volunteers collect all donated items, which are then distributed to students at the request of their nurse, counselor or social worker.

"How are you doing?" ... We hear this all the time, but when was the last time we really asked our kids/students? For adults, it is easier to answer this question, to understand emotions, and identify "stressors". However, a child may not know why he/she feels or acts in a certain way. I often use the analogy of an iceberg: we see reactions, emotions, behaviors (the top), but what is going on "under the surface"? Of course, we don't excuse inappropriate behaviors, but rather we try to help a child understand and handle their reactions in healthy and positive ways.

As always, if you are concerned about your child, are noticing changes, just wondering "how he/she is doing", please let me know if you would like me to check in with them. This is especially true and important for virtual students since it is more challenging for them to feel connected, so please contact me.
