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

If FSSD is closed for inclement weather, all remote and virtual learning will be cancelled as well.

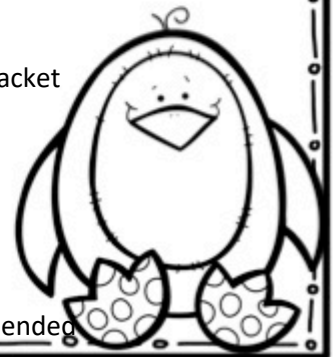
### Recess Cold Weather Safety Guidelines

The following conditions are considered when teachers determine outdoor safety:

- Temperature
- Wind Chill
- Length of time outdoors
- Adequacy of clothing for children
- Condition of the school playground

Increased caution is practiced when temps (including wind chill factor) reach below 40 degrees. Recommended proper clothing based on the temperature is:

- **Below 60 degrees:**  
Long sleeves or light jacket
- **Below 50 degrees:**  
Jacket and long pants
- **Below 40 degrees:**  
Jacket, long pants, gloves, hat
- **Below 35 degrees:**  
Indoor recess recommended



### Ready4K

Through a special partnership between the TN Department of Education and the Governor's Early Literacy Foundation, Tennessee families will have free access to Ready4K, a research-based text messaging program, that helps bridge the gap between classroom and home. This is a free resource coming in January that will support all families with pre-K through 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students.

Ready4K delivers three texts with fun facts and tips to provide your families with simple, engaging tips to help your students continue to learn while at home. The messages match each child's age, even if families have more than one child.

On Monday, January 11, each pre-K through 3 parent will receive a text message letting you know the Ready4K program is launching and you will begin receiving weekly text messages. Parents do have an option to opt out if you wish, however, we hope you find this tool beneficial.

#### **Did you know?**

- One out of four children struggle with reading and learning because of undiagnosed vision problems
- 80% of learning in the classroom is visual
- The majority of the vision problems that interfere with reading and learning are very treatable
