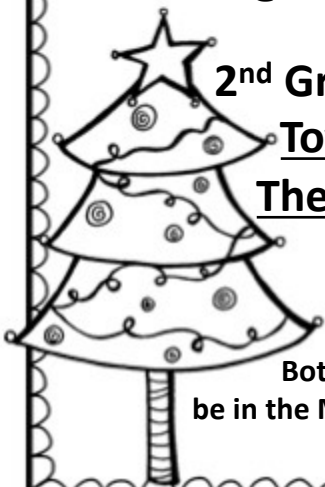

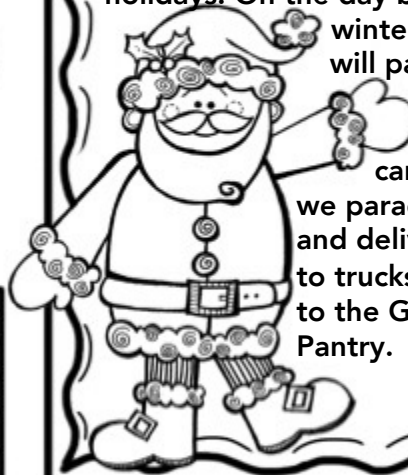

GRACEWORKS Canned Food Drive December 1-17

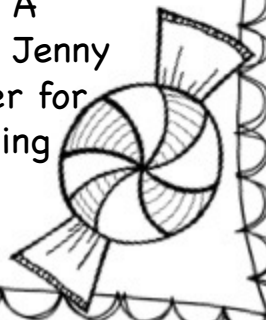

Flu Season has arrived! It's not too late to get the flu vaccine! National Influenza Vaccination week is December 5-11, 2021. MES staff and student flu vaccine clinics have been completed, but your student can still receive the vaccine from their physician or at the Williamson County Health Department located at 1324 Main Street in Franklin. You can call 615-794-1542 to schedule an appointment.

4. Light switches/door handles
