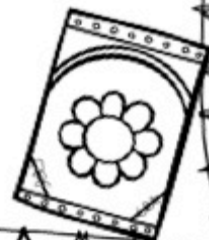
End-Of-The-Year Virtual Device Drop Off

4th Grade Graduation

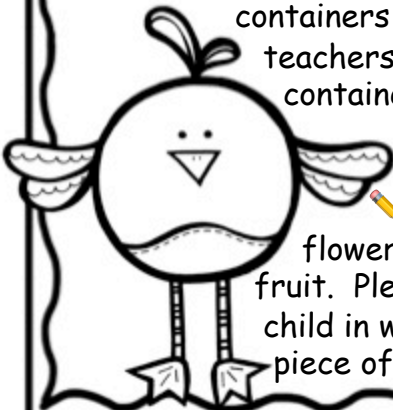

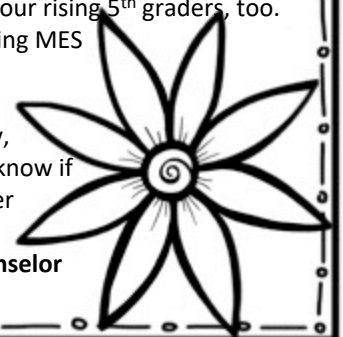


Mr. C's Counselor Notes

LOST & FOUND at MES

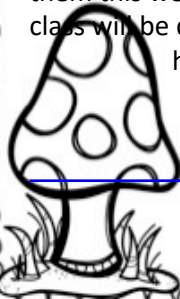

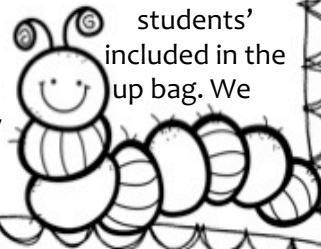
